ENTRIES

1. \$2.00 /entry and Children free.
2. OFFICE ENTRIES CLOSE 4PM FRIDAY 2nd May 2025.
3. GST will apply if an Exhibitor enters an Exhibit as a Business entity, the Exhibitor has an ABN, and the Exhibitor is REGISTERED for GST.

Where GST applies, the Association will pay the prize money quoted in this Schedule plus
10% GST. The Gympie Show Society will issue a recipient created tax invoice for prize money
paid.

Please provide your ABN and GST registration details on entry form if you are entering as a business entity

EXHIBIT DELIVERY AND COLLECTION

1. Exhibits are to be delivered to the Show Pavilion on the following days and times:
 - a. Friday 9th May between 1pm and 4pm
 - b. Saturday 10th May between 9am and 11am.
2. Exhibits forwarded by mail must arrive by 4pm Wednesday 7th May.
3. Exhibits are to be collected from the Show Pavilion on Sunday 18th May between 10am and 12pm.
4. Exhibits not collected on the above date may be collected from the Show Office between 10am and 4pm, Monday to Friday until the 31st May.
5. Exhibits not collected by 4pm Friday 30th May shall be disposed of by the Gympie District Show Society Inc.

JUDGING

1. Judging commences at 12pm on Saturday 10th May and continues onto Monday 12th May.
2. At no time must the Judge be made aware of the name of the exhibitor. Under no circumstances must this information or any information likely to influence his or her decision be given to the Judge.
3. The Judge has the right to decide not to award first prize if work is considered not up to the first prize standard.
4. If an exhibitor exhibits in a name other than his or her own name, and such exhibits will be awarded prizes (where merited) and points awarded accordingly to the name on the exhibit i.e., where prizes awarded on a special point system and a person exhibits in more than one name, they shall, for the purpose of awarding points, be two separate persons.

GENERAL RULES

1. **WORK MUST NOT BE MORE THAN TWO YEARS OLD.** This rule will be strictly adhered to at the Gympie Show and any older work will be disqualified.
2. Exhibits cannot be entered, nor competed in, more than one class.
3. Non-competitive exhibits will not be received.

4. To assist the Stewards in the arranging and displaying of the exhibits, the exhibitors' ticket containing the name and address of the owner must be securely attached to each piece of work.
5. The Show Society Pavilion Chief Steward or the Judge reserves the right to reclassify any entries deemed to be entered in the wrong class and to amend any class where items are not comparable for Judging.
6. No work to be washed except material used in patchwork entries.
7. No competitor to be penalized for having more than one entry in any one class i.e., a person with three (3) entries in one class is eligible to win first, second and third.
8. Once an article has won a first prize at a Gympie Show, it is not eligible to enter again.
9. Wherever possible all exhibits shall be displayed immediately after Judging.
10. In all Needlework, the cut of the garment, neatness of stitches and cleanliness of work will be taken into consideration at Judging.
11. All pictures must be framed or mounted and rigid. They must have securely attached wire or other suitable material for hanging (masking tape is unsuitable as it will not hold).
12. Stewards cannot repair or replace unsuitable attachments.
13. Entries are accepted entirely at owners' risk. Society, its members and volunteers will not be liable for any loss or damage to exhibits or any property whatsoever and however such damage or loss occurs. All reasonable care is taken always.
14. No Verbal or written correspondence will be entered into. Judges discussion final.

PATCHWORK QUILTING

1. Rod pocket on entries.
2. Large entries are displayed depending on space and number of entries.
3. Mitred corners (binding) preferred but not essential.
4. Binding can either be hand stitch on machine. Hand stitched to the back is preferred.
5. Quilts to be unused and less than 2 years old.
6. Entry tag at the bottom of the quilt.
7. Quilts that are not to be hung outside of glass cupboards are to have a 'PLEASE DO NOT HANG OUTSIDE' tag attached.
8. Quilting done on a domestic machine to have a label attached.

PLEASE STATE AGE ON ALL ENTRIES

1. Entries may be divided if enough received.
2. Do not leave threads hanging. Tie them off and snip off excess.
3. Make sure you have not left any sections of the seams with raw edges visible.
4. Judges usually turn the item inside out to see if the inside is as neat as the outside.
5. If you are doing embroidery do not start with a knot. Leave a small amount of thread at the back (wrong side) of work and work the first few stitches you do over this thread.
6. If you embroider a pattern on the item, the judge will look at the back and if they cannot tell what the pattern is, points will be lost.
7. When you have used all your thread in the needle, or have finished altogether, your thread should be on the back of your work. Thread the needle under the last 4 or 5 stitches and gently pull the thread through. Snip off the thread as this looks neater than trying to tie a knot.
8. Judges will put aside work that is not finished off neatly on the wrong side, even if the work is beautifully done on the right side.
9. Use no longer than 40cm length threads to prevent knotting, stretching, and fraying.
10. Keep work as clean as possible while working on article.
11. DO NOT wash the article before entering it in a competition.

12. Remembering these simple hints will allow your work to be presented to the judge in the best possible manner.
